## INQUIRING MINDS WANT TO KNOW...

At our recent contest (NAQP) one operator asked:

### What is the opposite of Search and Pounce?

*Search and Pounce* is the operating style where you work up and down the band looking for stations calling CQ, or QRZ "Contest." The stations you work are "holding a frequency" and continue calling on the same frequency for a long period of time or for the entire contest.

The opposite of *Search and Pounce* is referred to as *Running a Frequency*. This style of operation locates an open frequency (often before the contest opens) and calling CQ. Stations come to you in this style.

Which is a more efficient contest operation? Actually, both are recommended. Often we use both in the contest in order to work as many

Make sure you have a family emergency plan. Your family may not be together when disaster strikes, so it is important to plan in advance: how you will contact one another; how you will get back together; and what you will do in different situations.

#### Family Emergency Plan:

- \* It may be easier to make a long-distance phone call than to call across town, so an out-of-town contact may be in a better position to communicate among separated family members.

- \* Be sure every member of your family knows the phone number and has coins or a prepaid phone card to call the emergency contact.

- \* You may have trouble getting through, or the telephone system may be down altogether, but be patient.

#### Emergency Information:

Find out what kinds of disasters, both natural and man-made, are most likely to occur in your area and how you will be notified. Methods of getting your attention vary from community to community. One common method is to broadcast via emergency radio and TV broadcasts. You might hear a special siren, or get a telephone call or emergency workers may go door-to-door.

#### Emergency Plans:

You may also want to inquire about emergency plans at places where your family spends time: work, daycare and school. If no plans exist, consider volunteering to help create one. Talk to your neighbors about how you can work together in the event of an emergency. You will be better prepared to safely reunite your family and loved ones during an emergency if you think ahead and communicate with others in advance

## VANITY CALL SIGN FEE INCREASE

On August 11, the FCC announced that the cost of an Amateur Radio vanity call sign will increase 60 cents, from \$11.70 to \$12.30. The increase has been published in the Federal Register and will take effect September 25, 2008.

The FCC is authorized by the Communications Act of 1934, As Amended, to collect vanity call sign fees to recover the costs associated with that program. The vanity call sign regulatory fee is payable not only when applying for a new vanity call sign, but also upon renewing a vanity call sign for a new 10 year term.
